Our Values

At Young Friends, safeguarding is woven into everything we do. We take our Prevent Duty seriously — but we implement it in a way that reflects the real developmental needs of early years children: with **kindness**, **curiosity**, **and emotional safety** at the core.

- Sustainability Prevention and protection are rooted in long-term relationships
- Respect We foster mutual respect, not fear
- Authenticity Children are supported through open conversation, not avoidance
- Supportive Leadership Staff are equipped, alert and confident
- Community We celebrate diversity, listen actively, and address concerns early

Policy Statement

This policy sets out how we fulfil the *Prevent Duty* as part of our wider safeguarding responsibilities. The Prevent Duty is a legal requirement under the **Counter-Terrorism and Security Act 2015** and is part of **Keeping Children Safe in Education (DfE)** and the **EYFS Statutory Framework**.

We understand that early years settings play a vital role in preventing children from being drawn into extremism or radicalisation by:

- Promoting inclusive values and open thinking
- Building children's emotional resilience
- Training staff to recognise early warning signs
- Taking action if concerns arise

What We Do in Practice We:

- Promote British Values throughout daily interactions and respectful modelling
- Encourage turn-taking, cooperation and empathy
- · Provide safe, respectful spaces for discussion and expression
- Teach children to celebrate difference and challenge unfairness
- Have zero tolerance for any form of discrimination, exclusion or prejudice
- Empower staff to reflect on their own attitudes, language and responses

British Values in Our Setting

We promote:

- Democracy Through choice, voice and turn-taking
- Rule of Law Through clear boundaries and understanding why rules matter
- Individual Liberty Through child-led exploration and the right to feel safe
- Mutual Respect and Tolerance Through our commitment to listening, inclusion and not forcing cultural assumptions

We do not "teach" these values explicitly — we **live them**.

Staff Training and Responsibilities

All staff:

- Receive Prevent Duty training during induction and annual updates
- Are alert to signs of vulnerability, including:
 - Isolation
 - Sudden behaviour changes
 - Comments that echo extremist ideologies (in age-appropriate ways)
 - o Parental language or attitudes that raise concern
- Know how to report concerns to the DSL
- Understand their responsibility under the Whistleblowing and Safeguarding Policies

The **DSL** and Deputy DSL's:

- Have completed additional Prevent training
- · Monitor and act on Prevent-related concerns
- Liaise with Brighton & Hove Prevent Lead if necessary

Safe and Inclusive Practice

- We avoid tokenistic "celebrations" of culture and instead focus on the real lived experiences of our children and families
- We encourage empathy and curiosity through stories, loose parts, open conversation and inclusive language
- Children are never judged for their questions we welcome safe, age-appropriate dialogue

Partnership with Families We:

- · Work respectfully and transparently with all families
- Share our values and expectations at induction
- Will raise concerns with families first unless it would place the child at risk
- Involve external agencies only when appropriate and in line with safeguarding procedures

Record Keeping and Referrals

- Concerns are recorded in line with our Safeguarding Policy
- The DSL decides whether concerns warrant a Prevent referral to the Channel Panel
- Referrals are confidential and handled in the best interest of the child
