Our Values

At Young Friends, we treat each child as an individual with their own path — not a data point on a graph. Our two-year progress checks are carried out in close partnership with families, through calm observation and professional reflection, not formal testing.

- Sustainability We document only what matters and avoid excessive paperwork
- Respect The check is about the child, not the adult or the system
- Authenticity Reviews are honest, human and grounded in daily experience
- Supportive Leadership Staff are trained to notice, reflect and discuss with care
- Community We work together with parents and families to support every child's potential

Policy Statement

This policy outlines how we meet the statutory requirement to review each child's progress in the **prime areas of the EYFS** between the ages of **24 and 36 months**. At Young Friends, this is a collaborative, thoughtful process that avoids deficit-based language and celebrates the child's whole self.

Purpose of the Progress Check is:

- To summarise a child's development in Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Communication and Language, and Physical Development
- · To share strengths, emerging needs, and areas where extra support may be helpful
- To support early identification of SEND
- · To build stronger relationships with families and align support at home and nursery

Our Approach We:

- **Observe** the child naturally across several weeks not via checklist
- Involve key persons who know the child well
- Use real-life examples from play, routines, and interactions
- Create a written summary in clear, human language (not jargon)
- Discuss the summary in person with families
- · Listen deeply to family views and concerns
- Share next steps together gently and respectfully

Timing and Process

- Completed between 24 and 36 months of age
- Usually led by the child's key person, with input from others as needed

Includes:

- Descriptive summary of development in each prime area Commentary on strengths and interests
- Any emerging concerns or additional needs
- Next steps for nursery and family support
- Shared with families via Famly and/or face-to-face
- · Signed by parent and practitioner once agreed

Working with Other Professionals

- If the child is already receiving outside support, we liaise with other professionals
- If concerns arise during the check, we discuss with the SENCO and DSL
- Families are supported with clear pathways to help (e.g. speech therapy, health visiting)
- We respect families' pace and choices, offering non-judgemental support

SEND and Inclusion

Children with SEND are included in all aspects of the check, with:

- Focus on what they can do
- Respect for their communication style and learning pathway
- Involvement of relevant specialists where appropriate
- Clear action planning without labelling or pressure

Communication with Families

We believe families are the child's first and foremost educator. We:

- Invite their insight and feedback at every stage
- Respect cultural and language differences in expression or milestones
- Celebrate each child's uniqueness
- Ensure no family feels blamed, excluded or confused

Storage and GDPR

- Progress Checks are stored securely on our encrypted Famly platform
- Parents have full access to view and discuss
- Any onward sharing (e.g. with Health Visitor) is done with consent
- All records are handled in accordance with our GDPR and Confidentiality Policy
